Regional Risk Assessments for occurrence of Heatwave conditions between 0800 Local Time on Friday and 0800 Local Time on Sunday.

The areas that are likely to be affected are:

Region	Risk	Comments
North East England	20 %	Criteria not expected to be met.
North West England	50 %	Criteria not expected to be met, but still hot on Friday and humid overnight into Saturday, with temperatures declining on Saturday.
Yorkshire and the Humber	50 %	Criteria not expected to be met, but still hot on Friday and humid overnight into Saturday. Highest temperatures most likely in the south of the region.
West Midlands	60 %	With a hot wind flow from the continent on Friday and Saturday there is a significant risk of temperatures exceeding thresholds, especially in the eastern counties.
East Midlands	60 %	With a hot wind flow from the continent on Friday and Saturday there is a significant risk of temperatures exceeding thresholds.
East of England	60 %	With a hot wind flow from the continent on Friday and Saturday there is a significant risk of temperatures exceeding thresholds.
Southeast England	60 %	With a hot wind flow from the continent on Friday and Saturday there is a significant risk of temperatures exceeding thresholds.
London	60 %	With a hot wind flow from the continent on Friday and Saturday there is a significant risk of temperatures exceeding thresholds.
Southwest England	30 %	Criteria not expected to be met.

General Comments:- The highest temperatures are likely on Friday (good confidence) then a very humid night to follow. Heavy thunderstorms in eastern areas on Saturday will lead to slightly lower maximum temperatures, but it will still be very humid.
