		•	Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards (DoLS)— The number of referrals the Council receives each week continues to be on an upward trend. The Council is currently receiving an average of 70 referrals per week and there is a backlog of assessments (vacancies within Local Authority team). The majority of referrals made by acute trusts are later withdrawn or result in an outcome of 'Not Granted — No Deprivation of Liberty'. A consequence of increasing capacity to reduce the waiting list is an increase in requests for further authorisations ("renewal" assessments). As a result of this, the waiting list has plateaued in recent months. This means that some cases in hospitals and care homes may take longer to allocate because there are more cases to risk assess and prioritise. No online referrals have been received from acute hospitals so far since introduction of the process										

Sherwood Forest Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust made 46 referrals in total, 3

granted, 22 not granted and 21 awaiting allocation / assessment.

Nottingham University Hospitals NHS Trust made 68 referrals in total, 2 granted, 31 not granted and 35 awaiting allocation / assessment.

DoLS currently subject to consultation with a potential recommendation that hospitals resume the responsibility of assessments in hospital. A Department of Health response is expected shortly.
