This plan, which spans 2015 to 2021, is the third iteration, covering the same footprint as the Sustainability and Transformation Plan, including Bassetlaw. It has been fully assured by NHS England, who now require the plan to be made publically available. The plan sets out a range of actions to be taken to improve children's mental health, and also outlines achievements within the last year.  Such achievements include mobilising new services to support children's mental health including Kooth police accuraciling the required to support for shildren who have										
	been sexuresolution a on outcom	health including Kooth online counselling, therapeutic support for children who have been sexually abused or exploited, and the primary mental health and crisis resolution and home treatment teams within CAMHS. There has been some impact on outcomes, with fewer young people being admitted to inpatient mental health beds from 15/16 to 16/17.										
	access to continue to	Challenges remain in ensuring that all young people in need of support have timely access to an appropriate level of emotional or mental health services. This will continue to be a focus within 2017/18, as will developing timely assessments for young people who attend A&E in psychological or psychiatric distress.										
	Five Year health is e	Implementation of the plan will enable CCGs to fulfil their requirements under the Five Year Forward View for mental health. A Green Paper on children's mental health is expected to be published by the government before Christmas, therefore this agenda will continue to be of significant political and public interest.
