of Paper:	 The minutes from the meeting held on 13 June 2018 are not yet ratified and so will follow. Key highlights from the meeting are reported below. ASSURE CDOP Annual Report: provided assurance that the Nottinghamshire CDOP continues to meet its statutory obligations in respect of child deaths. Learning and Development Annual Report: significant increase in number of people accessing e-learning was noted, and dedication by those on the training pool who ensure there is a varied and robust training programme in place. Safeguarding Children in Education: assurances were given that there is confidence in the schools safeguarding policies and procedures. They are responding to tackling emerging themes such as knife crime, radicalisation, mental health, anti- bullying, on line safety. Police have increased the number of police attached to schools recently. Universal health promotion looking at children being healthy and staying healthy is a key area for all schools. The latter 2 areas in particular require a partnership approach. Managing Allegations Against Staff: overall the team have seen an increase in contacts with the local area designated officers (LADOs) with an overall reduction in referrals. Increase in education referrals, decrease in foster care. Health and police referrals remain low however are comparable to other LAs. Assurance was given that when people resign during a LADO investigation the process does continue

	within the NSCB. There was an issue raised around social workers navigating around the health and police due to their complex systems and further work is required in this area.
•	Child Sexual Exploitation Audit: found that boys remain under reported, ages of exploitation are becoming lower, the auditors referred two of the cases back to children's social care for immediate action, all those cases that had a CSE strategy meeting were assessed as having good outcomes, there was a wide range of CSE tools which was good to see however increase in the promotion of the NSCB tool was a recommendation. The audit highlighted an issue of transitions between CSE and adult sexual abuse, which has been acknowledged at a national level and work has commenced around this area.

	Chair's Update: two Serious Case Reviews have now been signed off publication dates to be confirmed (subject to inquest date and sharing with the family). A further SCR report is due to be signed off in July. Children's Trust renamed Children and Families Alliance – governance arrangements including terms of reference reviewed. Risks reviewed including transition to new safeguarding arrangements, strategy meeting effectiveness and section 136 arrangements and Tier 4 CAMHS capacity. Thematic review on non-mobile babies that have obtained serious injuries; there have been 5 cases in the last month. Police noted that they have seen a significant increase in the number of appropriate referrals to them for babies with bruises mainly from urgent care setting across the County; it appears that the <i>'babies that don't cruise don't bruise'</i> message may be influencing this.
•	New Safeguarding Arrangements: noted that the revised national guidance for both Working Together and the new CDOP arrangements has not yet been published. Partners continue to meet to prepare for transition.
•	Operation Equinox/ Independent Inquiry into Child Sexual Abuse (IICSA): it was confirmed that the National Inquiry will be reviewing Nottingham and Nottinghamshire in October 2018. It was agreed that consideration will be given to undertaking a Learning Review after the IICSA hearings have concluded if it is felt that there were issues that had not been considered by the IICSA team. Publication of the interim IICSA report in April and the resulting recommendations were noted. <i>Please see briefing attached which outlines key recommendations</i> for health and an update on the CCG position in relation to the recommendations.
•	Ofsted: indications are that NCC are likely to have a full inspection of their front door services (e.g. MASH) sometime early next year.
•	Integrated Commissioning for Care Leavers: Nottinghamshire and City have been selected as a pilot site for this project which will be in the form of personal health care budgets. The pilot has been funded by NHS England and public health are leading on this.
•	Child Protection Information System (CP-IS) Update: All health

 providers are either life or in a position to go life on CP-IS with the exception of DBTH A&E department due to their electronic record Symphony. This is a national IT issue that is being addressed. Nottinghamshire Local Authority are due to go life by the end of June. It was stressed that this is not a replacement for any existing safeguarding procedures it is an additional checking process. NSCB executive Report: highlighted that some agencies are not attending as regularly as they would expect- being addressed by the Chair. ALERT There were no issues for escalation to the Governing Body.
