The self care NNE Practice Tour

The engagement and communications team (Nikki and Toni) have been touring the Nottingham North and East practices to talk to patients about self care and repeat prescriptions. We've been asking people to tell us about their usage and habits regarding repeat medicines and, so far, have the following response...



The results

- The majority of people (83%) haven't noticed a negative impact from changes to the prescribing of OTC
- The majority of people (88%) never receive prescriptions that they haven't requested and do not have excess amounts of prescription medicines at home (79%).
- The majority of people (89%) confirmed that they are aware that once the medicine has left the pharmacy it cannot be recycled or used by someone else.
- The majority of people (87%) have either a doctor or pharmacist explain to them why they are prescribed each of their medicines.
- The majority of people (59%) are offered regular health checks by either their local doctor's surgery for their prescribed medication.
- The majority of people (53%) confirmed that their pharmacy offers them a medicine review to discuss their medicines.
